Directions:

From Flemington / Whitehouse: (Route 22 or Route 78): Take 523 North to Oldwick and Route 517 (523 turns right across from Hildebrandt Nurseries just before you enter Oldwick - stay straight and you will be on Route 517). Go through Oldwick and continue on Route 517 to Fairmount. At the traffic light by the Fairmount Methodist Church (little white church with white steeple and red doors) diagonally across from cemetery, turn left onto Route 512. The Christie Hoffman Farm driveway is the third driveway on the left.

From Chester / Long Valley: Take Route 24 and 513 to Route 517 South (left turn at light in Long Valley). Stay on Route 517 until you reach the intersection with Route 512 (cemetery will be on your right and the Methodist Church will be diagonally across the intersection). Lenape Tracking Club's newest TDX dog was featured in a news article in the "Mercury" newspaper of eastern Pa.

Everyone is friendly and there is lots of coffee and food. Did I mention coffee? 8:00AM We draw first and get the second track. Since there are two teams of judges, we get the "white team". The "red team" is the other team - who seem to all have red hair. And our draw was to pick from the miniature, plastic Irish Leprechaun hats and look at the number inside the hat we drew.8:15 AM The judges' and exhibitors head out to the TD tracks. The actual tracks are in fields that are part of an immense preserve or refuge. The entire area is very pretty and idyllic.8:20 AM The first TD in our group is a German Shepherd, who unfortunately skips a few turns on the way to its glove. Very efficient in time though 8:48 AM Scully and I start our track. Scully has little hesitation at the start, so I know she is focused on the run. ## AMBOR Grants Tracking Titles

For those of you with a mixed breed or non-registerable dog earning a Tracking Title is now possible.

The American Mixed Breed Obedience Registration (AMBOR) "was established in 1983 in an effort to improve opportunities for mixed-breed dogs and to acknowledge the efforts and achievements of their handlers in obedience competition. AMBOR provides support to these handlers and affirms the accomplishments of mixed-breeds in all avenues of service to mankind."

According to Bill Wingfield AMBOR President,

"Earning tracking titles through AMBOR is pretty simple. You will need to order "Versa" sheets from us (a set is \$3), which the judge will complete and sign. A handsketch of the track is also required. No certification is required. You can certify if you wish. Some handlers have insisted on it so that they are treated the same as AKC dogs. But it's not required. The judge should be an AKC Tracking judge and the tracklayer should be experienced.

You can be evaluated in conjunction with a club's event or you can be evaluated one on one by the judge. If an AKC judge absolutely cannot be located, an experienced tracking instructor can be used, but we prefer a licensed judge."

There are no additional details about tracking on the website, but you can request the "versa" forms through the site.
